(Questions and Scriptures for further study)

Read Ephesians 2:11-16; 17-22.

What phrases does Paul use to describe what we were as non-Christians?

What do these phrases mean?

What two phrases does Paul use to describe our new state as Christians?

What does this teach us about what happens to us when we become Christians?

Given our new identity, should we Christians view ourselves as autonomous, independent individuals?

Why or why not?

Read 2 Corinthians 6:14-18.

List the different terms and images that Paul uses the church in relation to God.

This passage describes a special relationship between God and His people.

What obligations do the people of God have because of this special relationship to God?

Whose character are the people of God to represent?

What does this say about our desire to be autonomous?

Have you ever thought about how becoming a Christian means becoming part of a new people, the people of God? In light of the passages we have read, how should this truth change a) your relationship to other Christians, and b) your relationship to non-Christians?

If we better grasped this idea of being a people, how would that affect our interactions within the local church?

Once we grasp the fact that, as a church, we are the people of God, both an encouragement and a challenge follow. The encouragement comes from knowing that we're God's treasured possession, the people He has specifically loved and called to Himself.
